RACE 1

SOUTHERN GLORY (8) – Racing well currently with a couple of near misses of late over the course and distance. The handicapper has given him a chance by leaving him on a mark of 43 and he should go very close once again in this.

CAI POH WANG (6) – Class 5 debut for this Mok Zhan Lun-trained five-year-old and on the pick of his form (3rd off 55 last September), he can run a nice race.

PENNSLYVANIA (1) – A strong win in a better grade last time out at the expense of Purple Rain over 1200m and has since gone up five points, up in trip and with 2kgs off, that makes him interesting.

HOOGA NET (3) – Out of form in recent starts, but if he finds his old form, he is a chance. Conditions suit.

RACE 2

SUPER SMART (8) – His Restricted Maiden form can certainly be marked up with the runner-up Lim's Dream winning twice thereafter and this Young Keah Yong-trained three-year-old looks a progressive type and one who has plenty of movement off a mark of 57.

YULONG GREEN (3) – An improved effort last time on his second run at Kranji over the 1000m behind Invincible Ryker. A winner twice over 1200m in the UK, he can run well here over a preferred trip.

LONGHU (2) – A course and distance specialist with five wins under these conditions and with that in mind, he must be included for the numbers here.

BARTIMAEUS (1) – Made a positive start to racing life here with a nice win on this surface and now returns to the sandy stuff having run midfield behind Gingerella. Third in a trial since, chance.

RACE 3

SPIRIT OF D'WIND (1) - Races at Class 5 level for the first time here and should get a nice run just behind the speed from barrier 3. Was not suited by a slow tempo last start but still ran on strongly in the quickest last 400m of the race.

ALARANCH (5) – She can lead here and will give a great sight. Suited at 1000m with the light weight of 54.5kgs after the claim for Krisna Thangamani.

DAYUAN (4) – Finally gets back to Class 5 1000m. Has won two from two over this trip in this grade. Can improve sharply here.

JK FORMIDABLE (6) – Is off a freshen-up and can sprint well here. Just needs luck from the wide draw to run well.

RACE 4

DAZZLE GOLD (6) – Still quite lightly-raced and kept giving towards the line last time when second to Sacred Guru, dropping back in trip here should be fine and has been placed on the surface in the UK.

LIM'S KNIGHT (2) – In good form on the turf (preferred surface) and remains on a mark of 61, which gives him a strong chance if translating his turf form to Polytrack.

GOLD STRIKE (1) – Another who would be more at home on the turf but does go well fresh and is down in grade.

DRONE (4) – Sound effort last time out when fourth, might have something to prove at the trip but it is early days and should be included in the quartet.

RACE 5

KING OF GLORY (8) – I would have more confidence in Brexit being resolved sooner than any of these in this line-up. Having run arguably his best race last time, King Of Glory is an extremely tentative selection here.

NEO'S CLASSIC (2) – A winner last time and could easily start favourite in this, though it is worth considering that he never runs two races alike and will be carrying 12.5kgs more than last start.

CALL IT (1) – Winless in 15 starts but has a better barrier here and should be one for the quartet.

BERLINETTA (3) – Has actually won a race, three in fact! And for that reason, he should be considered some sort of hope in this extremely weak race.

RACE 6

SACRED REBEL (6) – Performed well on the Polytrack surface on debut in Singapore. Will likely be ridden with cover from the wide draw and with plenty of speed in this affair, he finds conditions to suit. Can surprise at value.

YULONG XIONGYIN (3) – Lightly-raced speedster who is well drawn to take up a forward role. If the race is run to suit, he is capable of giving a sight in front. Can contest the business end on best efforts.

FAME STAR (9) – Versatile customer who is hard to knock on recent outings. Switches to the Polytrack surface which will be no problem, so must be considered yet again. Capable of contending with the right breaks.

SAFEER (5) – Has been struggling to win in recent outings but has been knocking on the door. Isn't ideally suited but is capable of being competitive with even luck. Don't ignore.

RACE 7

MIKKI JOY (3) – Looks the standout on recent performances on the turf, has All-weather

form in Japan and would look the one to beat here.

DICTON (11) – Second to Mikki Joy last month and has some sound form to his name, including a good Polytrack win last August and can give Mikki Joy most to think about with the light weight.

WHAT'S NEW (10) – A course and distance winner off a 19-point lower mark back in September of last year and achieved a turf success since then. She is a decent type but given her form with the likely favourite, she is a place chance at best.

CLAUDIA'S BEAUTY (2) – Another talented mare in the field and she is making her return to the All-weather, on which she was last victorious. Fourth in the Queen Elizabeth II Cup behind the great Debt Collector in October. Place chance.

RACE 8

BENGAL LANCER (1) – Excellent run last time when chasing the useful Gingerella in a Kranji C. Unproven on the Polytrack but is open to further progression now with a new stable.

BURKAAN (4) – Impressive winner last time when scoring by nearly four lengths, now up eight points for that victory but should be followed now he has got his head in front.

TRAPIO (3) – Also a last start winner (on turf) and now tries the Polytrack again, has a bad gate to overcome but must be respected.

FUSION POWER (10) – Now with the in-form Shane Baertschiger camp and hasn't trialled too badly leading up to this. One to consider.
